

Book Cases & Reading Areas | Inspired by the prestigious lowa Writers' Workshop, the lobby invites guests to cozy up with a good read.

Roped-off Chairs | As lowa is traditionally the first US state to show support for presidential candidates, two chairs barred by a velvet rope pay tribute to the state's caucuses.

Wall Coverings | The lobby's walls are covered in work by local novelist Tom Taranto.

- 1. Field of Dreams | The 1989 cult classic follows an lowa farmer as he builds a baseball diamond within his cornfields.
- 2. Kurt Vonnegut | The famous American writer taught at the University of lowa's famed Writer's Workshop.
- 3. Nile Kinnick | A student and football player at the University of lowa, Kinnick won the 1939 Heisman Trophy and is the namesake for the university's football stadium.
- 4. Unicorn | A nod to the celebrated play "The Glass Menagerie", written by University of Iowa alum Tennessee Williams.

- 7. Wrestlers | The University of lowa wrestling program is one of the most successful athletic programs in NCAA Division 1.

- Roy "B. J." Armstrong | Benjamin Roy "B. J." Armstrong Jr. is a retired American professional basketball player. Armstrong had an illustrious career at the University of lowa as the Hawkeyes' all-time leader in assists with 517 upon graduation.
- 2. Gene Wilder | A University of lowa graduate and star of comedy classics including "Willy Wonka and the Chocolate Factory" and "Young Frankenstein."
- George Nissen | A University of lowa alum, Nissen was an American gymnast and inventor who developed the modern trampolinie, and made trampolining a worldwide sport and recreation.
- 4. Sheri Salata | Graduating from Universtiy of lowa in the early 1980s, Salata exceled in television production and eventually became co-president of the Oprah Winfrey Network (OWN) and president of Winfrey's Harpo Productions,

The University of lowa was the first public university to admit men and women on an equal basis.





match-up.


The Daily lowan was the first daily campus newspaper west of the Mississippi.


